Eucalyptus Oil (Eucalyptus Plenissima) AUD4.50

Eucalyptus oil has strong antiseptic and germicidal disinfectant properties which can be used as both a deodorizer and sanitiser. Its gentle invigorating aroma will relax and revitalize the senses. Eucalyptus oil has also been found to act as a stimulant for the nervous system. Therapeutic qualities include: relief from insect bites and cold sores; assisting circulation associated with aches and pains of muscle stiffness, soreness, cramping and arthritis; an aide and treatment for bronchitis, sinusitis, catarrh, colds, coughing, fever and flu.

Lavender Oil (Lavandula x Intermedia) AUD9.50

Lavender oil has a refreshing woody aroma and is frequently used as a household remedy. It is a relaxant for anxiety, stress, depression, headaches, migraines and insomnia. Lavender holds antiseptic properties for acne, cuts, bruises, scalds, sunburn, insect bites and itching as well as an allergy aide. Its properties assist in the prevention of permanent scar tissue and stretch marks. Lavender can be added to bath water for its luxurious relaxing and calming effects or rubbed into the temples for migraines. It has been traditionally stored in bed linen for its scent to aid with sleep and repels moths. Essential oils derived from the lavender flowers are antiseptic, anti halitosis, antispasmodic, calmative, sedative, cholagogue, diuretic, nervine and stimulant.

Lemon Myrtle Oil (Backhousia Citriodora) AUD10.50

Lemon Myrtle is an Australian native tree indigenous to the coastal sub-tropical rainforests of Queensland. The lemon myrtle leaf has a unique, refreshing aroma of a blend of lemongrass, lime and lemon. It is used in soaps, shampoo, conditioner, lip balm, body wash gels. The oil is also used in candles.

As an acne cream it would be vastly more effective than other products presently available on the market.

As our world becomes more and more toxic with its corresponding negative effect on our first line of defence, the immune system, this potently anti-microbial essential oil deserves a place among some of the most therapeutic oils the world has to offer.

Lemon Scented Ironbark Oil (Eucalyptus Staigeriana) AUD9.50

Lemon Scented Ironbark oil is a pale to dark yellow, somewhat oily liquid of a sweet and fresh, fruity-lemony aroma. Its therapeutic properties are anti-infectious, antiseptic, antiviral, anti-inflammatory and aides in the treatment of acne and oily skin. The rich scent makes it useful for soaps, perfumes and air refreshing as well as a mood lifter via the vaporization method.

Lemon Scented Tea Tree Oil (Leptospermum Petersonii) AUD9.50

Subtly lemon scented with a spicy undertone, this uplifting aroma assists those who are tired and lethargic. It allows lightness and joy to cleanse the mind and body – great for depression.

Therapeutic properties include treatment for acne and oily skin, tinea and insect bites. Lemon Scented Tea Tree oil is also stimulating for the mind and body and calming for aches and pains.

Peppermint Gum Oil (Eucalyptus Dives) AUD5.50

This oil is rich in peppertone, leading to many uses in aromatherapy. It is also used in commercial applications for deodorants, disinfectants, mouthwash, gargles and in veterinary practices. A traditional use for the leaves was in the relief of fever by fumigation. It was used in World War 1 as medicine for a meningitis outbreak and following that war, for the 1919 influenza epidemic.

Reported properties:

Antiseptic, astringent, tonic, antispasmodic, deodorant, expectorant, stimulant, antibiotic, rubefacient, febrifuge.

Rosalina Oil (Melaleuca Ericafolia) AUD10.50

This is a lovely oil, softer than tea tree with just a hint of rose, soothing, gentle and slightly pine scented. The colour is clear pale straw to golden yellow.

Rosalina has a moderately fast evaporation rate. It has also been shown to have a sedative effect and is rapidly absorbed through the skin and the nasal mucous membranes. A gentle expectorant with good anti-infectious properties, it is a deeply relaxing and calming oil, ideal for inducing sleep, which would be helpful in times of stress and insomnia.

Sandalwood Oil (Santalum Spicatum) AUD39.90

Extracted from plantation trees, West Australian sandalwood oil is a viable, environmentally friendly substitute for East Indian sandalwood. West Australian sandalwood is obtained from ethically harvested plants and has not been tested on animals. In skincare, sandalwood combined with lavender in an appropriate carrier oil is wonderful for dry, itchy skin. Sandalwood has a calming and harmonising effect to help reduce tension, fear, confusion and anxiety. It helps to encourage warmth, understanding and meaningful contact. It also has an historical application as an aid to meditation for religious ceremonies.

Tea Tree Oil (Melaleuca Alternifolia) AUD4.50

Native to Australia and traditionally used by Aboriginal people, Tea Tree oil has great germicidal qualities. It is used in a range of products including antiseptics, deodorants, shampoos and conditioners, soaps, hand and body lotions, creams, gels, liniments and nail polish removers. Tea Tree oil has also been used in the treatment of acne, athlete's foot, boils, burns, chicken pox, cold sores, cuts, carbuncles, impetigo, infections of the nail bed, itching, insect bites, ringworm, sores, scabies and warts. Tea Tree oil is used as an insect repellent and an immune system stimulant.

White Cypress Oil (Callitris Columellaris) AUD6.90

White cypress oil has a warm woody, spicy and earthy scent. It is good blending oil for anchoring the more elusive scents.

In aboriginal pharmacopoeia the leaves and twigs of callitris columellaris are used in fumigations for the treatment of colds and sores.

Store all oils below 30 C.
